- 2. Administrative duties are assigned to the faculty by constituting various committees comprising of a convener and three members.
- 3. Administrative and financial sanction is obtained before undertaking any job.
- 4. Staff meetings are held to discuss the plans and implementations made and executed by the institution.
- 5. The College is governed by the guidelines issued by the directorate and the university from time to time.

#### 6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

#### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Curriculum is designed at university level. Some of the members are Members, Board of studies. ( Dr Shashi, Asstt Prof Physical Education).

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

80% Teaching is done through conventional method of delivering lectures. This is complimented by lab work in practical subjects, Edusat, smart class room, language lab in other subjects. Students are engaged under Earn while you Learn scheme as well.

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Exams are conducted by the university. Students are evaluated at college level also on the basis of class tests, assignments and attendance in the class.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

Faculty members are encouraged to undertake research projects. They are granted study leave for the purpose. Three faculty members are pursuing their PhD.

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The college has taken over the possession of new science block. The construction of new academic block near completion. Maintenance and renovation is done when required. Automation of books is complete. 417 books were purchased this year besides a printer, scanner, bar code printer. Three journals have also been subscribed.

## 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Teaching and non teaching staff members are encouraged to attend professional development programs. Students too are involved in extension programs and extracurricular activities.

## 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Regular appointments are made by the government. The principal engaged the required number of teaching and non teaching staff.

## 6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

The students of job oriented courses like BBA,BAJMC,BTTM are sent for training or internship to industry, offices or local news channels.

#### 6.3.9 Admission of Students

Admissions were done online on the basis of merit. The whole process was transparent .1564 students were enrolled in 06 courses.


